## **Our Vision**

Australia acknowledges and respects the humanity and rights of asylum seekers and honours its international obligations by providing safe refuge and protection within Australia.

## **Our Mission**

We work collaboratively to shift public opinion on attitudes towards asylum seekers and advocate for a more humane and lawful asylum seeker policy for Australia.

## **Our Pillars**

We recognise the UN Convention on Refugees as the key multilateral treaty which defines the rights of asylum seekers and refugees and the legal obligations of states.

As a signatory to this Convention we call on the Australian Government to honour these obligations and demand they:

- 1. Bring an end to Operation Sovereign Borders
- 2. Close off shore regional processing centres and return all those arbitrarily detained to Australia
- 3. Commence the immediate processing of asylum seeker claims
- 4. Resettle all those determined to be refugees in Australia
- 5. Work collaboratively with UNHCR and South East Asian transit countries to establish well regulated and resourced processing centres that are controlled by Australia
- 6. Increase Australia's refugee intake.
